First-Ever Civic Assembly in Deschutes County to Continue Deliberations and Reach Recommendations on Youth Homelessness

BEND – The <u>Deschutes County Civic Assembly</u> on Youth Homelessness, a first-ever civic assembly of 30 lottery-selected residents from across the county, will resume deliberations to address youth homelessness TOMORROW on October 4 at OSU Cascades in Bend, Oregon.

The group will meet for three full days, culminating on October 6 with a voting session to agree on recommendations to be submitted to local authorities. The assembly's final recommendations will be shared with the Youth Action Board, the Central Oregon Intergovernmental Council, the Deschutes County Commissioners, and City of Bend Council. They will respond to the Civic Assembly's recommendations by the end of the year.

This is also the world's first tech-enhanced Citizens' Assembly where the entirety of the conversations are being recorded in an effort to improve the quality, legitimacy, and transparency of the process, and to generate outputs grounded in the voices of assembly members. The recordings are fully anonymised so that individuals can speak freely during deliberations.
