Community Oregon Urban/Rural Dialogue Questions (full list from Camp):

Top 3 Questions from Rural to Urban Colleagues:

- Is the rural voice over-represented or under-represented in Portland?
- How do you feel about state's rights and local control?
- What should the role of government be in our everyday lives?

Remainder of list:

- How do we define/feel about property rights?
- Who has a right to water and how is priority set? (How do we decide to use shared resources?)
- How do we allocate use of public land?
- How do you define your connection to place?
- Should urban folks have voice in rural and rural folks in urban?

Top 3 Questions from Urban to Rural Colleagues:

- Do rural people <u>not</u> want to live in diverse communities? Why or why not?
- In rural communities where are the people of color? Are they in leadership?
- What are the challenges of being a homogenous group (i.e. not having access to other types of people?)

Remainder of list:

- What is a concrete example of how urban and rural Oregon can move forward together?
- Do you feel valued by urban communities?
- What do you feel about fluoride in water?
- Is it harder to go against the grain/speak your truth in a smaller town?
- Do you feel there is bias by legislature on state policies?
- What keeps folks living in rural area (would you consider living in an urban area?)
- How does dissent show up in rural communities? How do you respond to things like hate crimes, or land disputes?
- Are rural politics generally trending conservative?
- Does equity work exist [in rural areas] and what does it look like if so
- Is there an assumption that rural communities are similar?
- Do tribal communities engage with other rural communities?
- How would you make people of color comfortable in your community? How can we connect?
- How do white supremacy groups show up in rural communities?
