Ronald Hall, J.D., is an enrolled member of the Mandan, Hidatsa and Arikara Tribes who has lived in the Fort Collins area for 30 years with his partner Roe Bubar. Mr. Hall has been active in Fort Collins as a consultant, business owner, volunteer, parent and youth soccer coach. He and Roe have organized a Fort Collins Native American Harvest Dinner each fall for the past 14 years. He consults with the City of Fort Collins to facilitate meetings with Tribal government representatives in matters impacting cultural and historic resources on city owned property, a role he has played with many US military installations and state agencies across the nation. His primary work is as Tribal Program Manager for North Dakota State University's Upper Great Plains Transportation Institute. Mr. Hall's career has been focused on representing Tribal interests and addressing the research, capacity building, technology transfer and strategic planning needs of Tribal transportation programs. He also works with state and federal transportation agencies on tribal issues. He has been fortunate to work with numerous Tribes, communities and people across the country. Mr. Hall is also on the Board of Trustees for Village Earth, a non-profit organization that provides fiscal sponsorship, training, and community based planning, data collection, analysis, and mapping resources for grassroots organizations in the US and around the world.
